
Find My Past and the 1921 Census

Home Library Service

Our Home Library Service has gone green and is now operating from a Peugeot e-expert van to cut down on carbon emissions. The Home Library Service supports people who can't make it to a library due to ill health, disability or caring responsibilities. It can visit your home, sheltered accommodation, nursing home or day centre once a month. It offers a wide range of books, audiobooks and large print, which can be borrowed for a month at a time.

We've launched our brand new baby book, Siarad Babi: Du a Gwyn / Baby Talk: Black and White, which will be gifted to all newborn babies by health visitors. At birth babies only see in black and white and shades of grey. By sharing bold pictures and talking to a baby over and over they will soon start to respond. Did you know that our libraries stock a range of books in large print and audio cd? If you can't make it to the library we offer a Home Delivery Service which can bring a regular supply of books to your door!

We also offer eBooks through the Borrowbox app, which enables you to change the size of the print on your screen, change the colour of the background, or zoom in on particular sections. If you prefer there's a great range of audiobooks on cd to choose from too.

Our digital services also include eMagazines and newspapers, which offer a variety of accessibility features, such as text to speech, to have the information read aloud..




